**Title:** "Towards effective management of marine mammals in the East Asia seas: The Marine Mammals Management Toolkit"

The Marine Mammal Twinning, part of the EU-funded Ocean Governance Project, is pleased to host a webinar in collaboration with <u>The Coordinating Body on the Seas of East Asia (COBSEA)</u>, and <u>the North-East Asian Marine Protected Areas Network (NEAMPAN)</u> - <u>North-East Asian Sub-Regional Programme for Environmental Cooperation (NEASPEC)</u>. The webinar will introduce the <u>Marine Mammals Management Toolkit</u> (developed by the Marine Mammal Twinning under the EU-funded Ocean Governance Project) as an innovative tool for the effective management of marine mammals in and around MPAs across the East Asian seas.

The Marine Mammals Management Toolkit is an online resource designed to help MPA managers and practitioners to better incorporate marine mammals into MPA management plans.
