# NEACAP National Workshop on Air Quality Management in Mongolia: Developments and Prospects

# Crystal Hall, 3/F, Blue Sky Hotel, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia 24 September 2025

#### Background

Air pollution poses a critical threat to human health, ecosystem and sustainable development in Mongolia. Ulaanbaatar, in particular, experiences high levels of air pollution during the winter season, with adverse consequences for public health and quality of life. Addressing these challenges requires coherent policy frameworks, strengthened institutional capacities, and practical technical solutions.

In response, the North-East Asia Clean Air Partnership (NEACAP) under the North-East Asian Subregional Programme for Environmental Cooperation (NEASPEC) is convening a national workshop to support Mongolia's efforts in formulating and implementing effective air quality policies. Taking place back-to-back with the NEASPEC 28th Senior Officials Meeting (SOM-28) and the NEACAP Second Policy Dialogue, the workshop will serve as a platform for capacity building, strategic policy discussions, and regional cooperation.

#### **Objectives**

#### The workshop aims to:

- Facilitate national dialogue on air pollution policy setting and implementation in Mongolia.
- Strengthen the capacity of national and local stakeholders to design and apply evidence-based, actionable strategies.
- Promote peer learning by sharing policy experiences and best practices from China,
   Japan, and the Republic of Korea.
- Enhance regional cooperation and knowledge exchange under the NEACAP framework.

A key component of the workshop will be a dedicated session on country presentations, where experts from China, Japan, and Republic of Korea will share their national experiences in developing and implementing air pollution policies. This will be complemented by presentations on Mongolia highlighting current initiatives, challenges, and opportunities, fostering a mutual learning process.
